

What is Connect?

Connect Academy was established in the fall of 2008 after a three-year planning period and a Specialized Secondary Program (SSP) grant from the state of California.

Connect is intended for students who want an alternative to the traditional core humanities curriculum.

The course sequence includes: U.S. History, American Literature, and Design Lab I in the junior year and U.S. Gov't/econ, senior composition/non-fiction, and Design Lab II in the senior year. Curriculum is coordinated across subject areas, and, at times, grade levels.

Sample Quarter 1 unit of instruction for juniors:

In US History, students learned about the founding of the nation, wrote first-person diaries about Columbus' arrival on the continent, and studied important documents such as the Declaration of Independence and Constitution. In English, students read *Our America* and a post-Civil War era play, *The Piano Lesson*, drawing on information learned in history class. Students honed writing skills with EAP-style prompts, reviewed on elements of literature, and wrote their own books. The

Design Lab allowed students to design and create linocuts for book covers, illustrate their stories, and bind the books; this project followed initial explorations of design discipline and application. To better illustrate the connections between the arts and local history, a fieldtrip to San Francisco's Mission District was organized to see the Mission Dolores and participate in a City Walks tour of murals that illuminate the connection between culture and community. Finally, in a research-based project, students collaborated with Voices to Vision to redesign the waterfront or worked with local experts to propose a design for the Connect Garden and Compost Project; these proposals were judged by a panel that included Connect Academy partners.

Community-Based Learning Projects

As part of the Connect curriculum, seniors will develop and execute an individualized community-based learning project. Seniors formulate a core question to guide their research and project.

The components of the project include: a community-based learning experience (a mini-internship, shadowing a professional, volunteering, etc.), a research paper, a visual design lab product, a presentation to the school and local community, and a portfolio with reflection on all completed benchmarks.

Student Spotlight: Hannah Hsieh

To research her essential question -- Who is responsible for obesity in America? -- senior Hannah Hsieh interviewed a local dietician, enrolled in a one-day nutrition course, and narrowed her research to focus on the most recent updates about obesity in the U.S. Through this process, she learned that 50% of American adults are carrying around an excess amount body fat. "Americans don't have the time or the knowledge to make a healthy and delicious meal. My idea for my senior project is to make a healthy cookbook... to get young people cooking healthy, well-balanced meals instead of eating out." The recipes will yield individual portion-sizes to ease the burden of cooking for one but recipes can be multiplied for larger groups.
